HOW TO TAKE PREP

There are different ways to take PrEP

- **Daily:** Taking one pill every day for lasting protection
- **On-demand:** Taking PrEP pills only when you are at risk for getting HIV

FIRST TIME USING PREP?

- PrEP is safe for most people.
- Some people may feel nausea, headache, diarrhoea, bloating or tiredness when they first start, but this usually improves within a few days or weeks.
- Speak to a doctor, nurse or pharmacist if side effects are severe or do not improve.

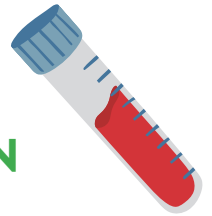
